


Members' Newsletter March 2013

SPRING PRODUCTION 21-23 MARCH

Our next play, **Occupational Hazards**, is a satire on modern life, in particular the way that news is carefully managed. On the way, we come across the worship of money, trendy vicars, the evangelical wing of the Church of England, homophobia, police officers who are caring but box-ticking and ineffectual, loudmouth PR consultants, rent-a-crowd protesters – and a bishop who's definitely in the wrong job.

The vicar of Hawk's End (Ronald Stevenson), has just become chaplain to a City finance company, thanks to

his brother (Bob Pugh). As a result, anticapitalist protesters (led by Jeanette

Brown) have occupied his church – remember the Occupy protest at St Paul's? The vicar's wife (Jane Crittenden) is caught in the middle, as the bishop's crisis management specialist (Kelly Mason) storms in to deal with the media.

The cast is completed by Ann Monk and Tony Burrin as churchwardens, Christine Marriott and Guy Makey as police officers, and Phil Green as the bishop. The play is directed by Michael Black.

Club by Clive Lawrence, and will be performed in the Commemoration Hall, Huntingdon, on Thursday to Saturday, 21 to 23 March, starting at 7.30 pm.
