# HELP HELP HELP!

There have been recent changes to the Licensing Act 2003 that will affect the serving of alcohol at future performances at the Commemoration Hall.

The Town Council is moving to obtain a Premises Licence however we will require a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) who will supervise the sale of alcohol. The DPS must hold a Personal Licence. To obtain a Personal Licence the person must hold a National Certificate for Personal Licence Holders qualification.

What does that mean for the Club? ...... We need your HELP!!!!

# Are there any club members who have such a licence and would be willing to supervise the sale of alcohol during our next performance (17<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> November)?

We really need your help with this as the sale of alcoholic beverages at our performances is seen as enjoyable refreshment at intervals, like it is for any normal theatre performance.

Please let either Michael Black or me know if there is any way you can help the Club out with this change in the Act.
