# Club invests in better stage lighting at the Commemoration Hall

The trustees of the Commemoration Hall have decided to raise funds to upgrade the stage lighting, which is likely to cost between  $\pounds 16,000$  and  $\pounds 20,000$ . This will be very useful for the Club, as we won't have to hire so much lighting for our productions.

We've decided to contribute £1,000 towards the investment. This is the sum left to the Club by Jack Hyde, a member from our first production, in 1944, until his death in 2003. He acted in well over 100 plays, ranging from *No sex please, we're British* to *Dr Who and the Empress of Othernow*, by Club member Peter Vialls. He also directed several, and was at various times chair and treasurer for a number of years.

Jack also appeared in many Shakespeare at the George productions, and was a trustee of SAG.

We're delighted to put Jack's money to such good and lasting use. A plaque will be fixed in the hall, to commemorate Jack and naming Huntingdon Drama Club as the donor.







# Plans for 2007

### Spring production

Rehearsals for *Joking apart* are going well and we'll be performing at the end of this month – 29 to 31 March. Please encourage as many people as possible to come to this rather black comedy by Alan Ayckbourn.

## Summer production

For what's probably our first-ever full-length summer production, we've chosen Agatha Christie's *A murder is announced*, directed by Kelly Mason. This is vintage Christie, with Miss Marple heading a cast of seven women and five men. The read-through will be on Wednesday, 4 April, with rehearsals starting the following week. Performances: 22, 23, 29 and 30 June, in various venues. More details to follow.

## Autumn production

This will be Charlotte Brontë's *Jane Eyre*, adapted by Willis Hall. Directed by Michael Black, the play can be performed by any number of people from 12 upwards. Performance dates: 15-17 November in the Commemoration Hall.
