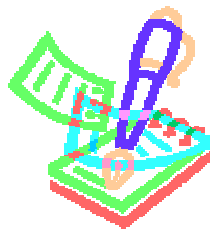
Other items

Round the Horne ... revisited 2
Eight of us had a great trip to London on 2 April. First an excellent lunch in Sarastro, in Drury Lane, which must be the most theatrical and operatic restaurant in London.

And then to Leicester Square, for one of the funniest shows in years, the 1960s radio series *Round the Horne* adapted (by one of the original writers) for the stage. Five actors played the regulars, including Kenneth Horne and Kenneth Williams, and they recreated Dame Celia Molestrangler, Rambling Syd Rumpo, Julian and Sandy, and the other immortal characters. The audience (many of them too young to remember the 60s) couldn't get enough.

In a serendipitous connection with Huntingdon Drama Club, the actors playing Kenneth Williams and Betty Marsden have both appeared in 'Fallen Angels'.

Round the Horne ... revisited is the perfect antidote to the troubles of the modern world, and it's coming to the Cambridge Arts Theatre for the week beginning 6 June. It's well worth seeing.
