The film version of John Dighton's sparkling comedy of misadventure **The Happiest Days of your Life** had long been a favourite of mine, and I was delighted when the Club gave me the chance to bring the original play to the stage. This classic British comedy is, I think, the perfect 'winter warmer' – guaranteed to raise a laugh.

The play was first performed at the Apollo Theatre, London, in 1948, and a very different version of it was filmed in 1950: the cast included Margaret Rutherford (Miss Whitchurch), Alistair Sim (Mr Pond) and Joyce Grenfell (Miss Gossage).
